Dear Mr. Wagener,

Thank you for your prompt e-mail reply of Sunday, February 11, to my Synopsis of an Investigative Journalism Proposal.

You asked "What specifically, would you have me do?" My specific answer is this:

- 1. Recognize what is at stake, namely, proving to the public through the media, rather than in a lawsuit, that the judges of the Federal Judiciary, the Branch of Government whose members are supposed to incarnate moral integrity and respect for the law, have engaged in wrongdoing intentionally through coordination and that the Supreme Court of the U.S. has known and tolerated their wrongdoing for decades. This would shake our government and society to their foundation. To realize this, consider that while the Watergate Burglary caused the resignation of President Richard Nixon in August of 1974 and sent to prison many of his top White House aides, their abuse of power would have naturally come to an end as President Nixon's second four-year term drew to a close. By contrast, federal judges appointed to courts established under Article III of the Constitution hold office for life "during good Behaviour". Can you begin to imagine the profound constitutional crisis that our investigative journalism would cause if we could prove, or set in motion the investigation that eventually proved, that top judges of the Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit, not to mention if with the knowledge of Supreme Court justices, know that there is an ongoing bankruptcy fraud scheme in the Second Circuit involving judges but tolerate it? It is reasonable to think that we would be deemed to have rendered a significant public service and in the process make a name for ourselves, and deservedly so.
- 2. To that end, we would engage in investigative journalism:
 - a) Interview members of the court, particularly the clerical and legal staff, who must know what goes on in the court but would only reveal it off the record because, though they may not dare blow the whistle on their higher-ups, they need not be crooks too and may be repulsed by their higher-ups' corruption and hypocrisy;
 - b) Search for the external manifestation of the wrongdoing that goes on in the court, that is, illicit financial activity as revealed by the unjustified discrepancies between the financial reports that judges must file by law and the hidden assets that we would find in filings in county clerks' offices and by showing that the standard of living of such judges is higher than their publicly known government salary and declared income can explain;

c) Interview lawyers, trustees, creditors, and debtors, particularly those involved in two especially egregious bankruptcy cases in the U.S. Bankruptcy and District Courts, concerning which I have gathered evidence for six years. (See the attached motion, which was also denied by the Court of Appeals, 2nd Cir.) This shows that we are not fishing; rather we are trying to get to the bottom of it all by exposing a bankruptcy fraud scheme involving judges, trustees, lawyers, and debtors. These two cases are just test cases. If we show that there is corruption and that it has been known and is being tolerated by judges higher in the hierarchy, it would illustrate what goes on throughout the judiciary so that the investigation would extend across the nation.

If you are interested in this investigative journalism project, what resources would you commit to it and what expertise do you have to engage in it?

If you do not have the necessary resources, do you have contacts in the media to be able to interest others who do have such resources and are willing to commit them to the project, particularly those capable of bringing them to bear initially out here in New York?

I look forward to hearing from you.
